When using an electrical appliance, basic precautions should always be followed including the following:

WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRIC SHOCK, OR INJURY:

- Do not run vacuum unattended.
- Do not use to pick up flammable or combustible liquids, such as gasoline, or use in areas where they may be present.
- Do not vacuum, or use this Wet/Dry vacuum near flammable liquids, gases, or explosive vapors like gasoline or other fuels, lighter fluids, cleaners, oil-based paints, natural gas, hydrogen, or explosive dusts like coal dust, magnesium dust, grain dust, or gun powder. Sparks inside the motor can ignite flammable vapors or dust.
- To reduce the risk of health hazards from vapors or dusts, do not vacuum toxic materials.
- Do not use or store near hazardous materials.
- Do not pick up anything that is burning or smoking, such as cigarettes, matches, or hot ashes.
- Do not expose to rain. Store indoors.

- Keep hair, loose clothing, fingers, and all parts of body away from openings and moving parts.
- Use extra care when cleaning on stairs.
- Use only as described in this manual. Use only manufacturer's recommended attachments.
- This vacuum is provided with double insulation. Use only identical replacement parts. See "DOUBLE INSULATION INSTRUCTIONS".

When using as blower:

This Wet/Dry Vacuum is double-insulated, eliminating the need for a separate grounding system. Use only identical replacement parts. Read the instructions for Servicing Double-Insulated Wet/Dry Vacuum before servicing. Use this Wet/Dry Vacuum as described in this manual. Observe the following warnings that appear on the motor housing of your Wet/Dry Vac.

EXTENSION CORDS

When using an extension cord with your Wet/Dry Vacuum refer to the following table to determine the required A.W.G. wire size. Before using the cleaner make sure the power cord and extension cord are in good working condition. Make repairs or replacements before using the vacuum cleaner. Only use extension cords that are rated for outdoor use.

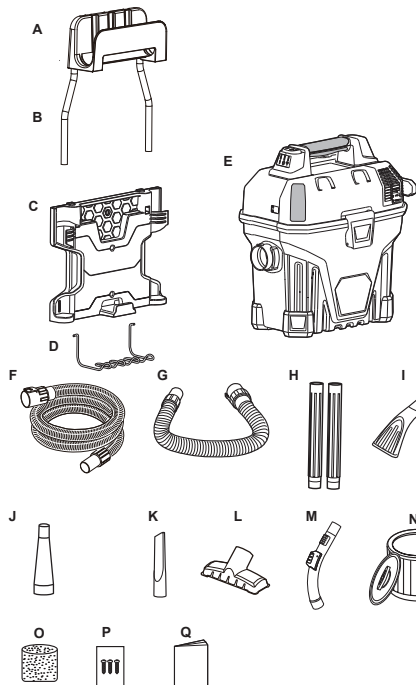

UNPACKING & CHECKING CARTON CONTENTS

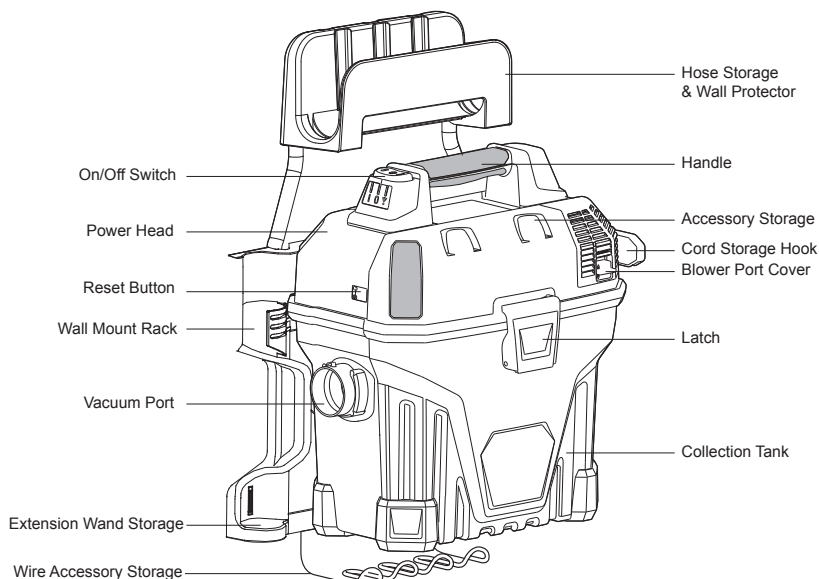


Remove all contents from the box. Remove the power head and take out any contents inside the collection tank. Check each item against the carton contents list.

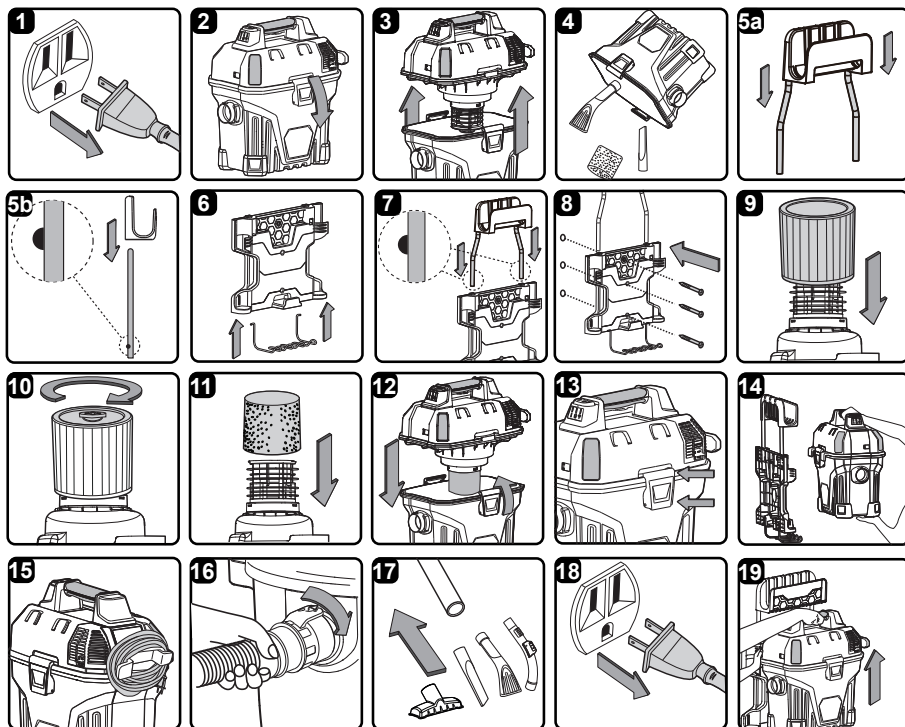

GENERAL ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS



⚠ WARNING: DO NOT PLUG POWER CORD INTO POWER OUTLET. MAKE SURE PLUG IS DISCONNECTED BEFORE ASSEMBLING THE WET/DRY VACUUM. TO REDUCE THE RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE TO RAIN.

UNPACKING YOUR WET/DRY VACUUM & GENERAL ASSEMBLY

1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet (Fig. 1).
2. Undo the latches (Fig. 2).
3. Lift the power head off the collection tank (Fig. 3).
4. Remove the contents from inside the collection tank. Make sure you have all contents as listed on page 7 (Fig. 4).
5. Insert the steel rod into the hose storage rack, and snap into place. Make sure the buttons on the rod are directed as illustrated (Fig. 5a & 5b).
6. Locate the two openings on the bottom of the wall mount rack and insert the wire accessory storage into the wall mount until they lock in place. Make sure the wire accessory storage is directed towards the front side of the wall mount rack (Fig. 6).
7. Insert the steel rod with hose storage rack into the two holes located on the top of the wall mount rack. Ensure the Vacmaster logo is facing forward (Fig. 7).


IMPORTANT! WALL MOUNT RACK AND STORAGE ASSEMBLY

- Do not mount the rack over 5 ft / 1.5 m from the floor.
 - Do not screw the rack to drywall only. Secure the screws to a stud.
 - Do not hang from or sit on the wall mount rack.
 - Do not exceed the 40 lb / 18 kg maximum weight limit.
8. Locate a wall stud that is not more than 18 ft / 5.5 m away from an electrical outlet. Align the three screw holes on the wall mount rack so that they are over the stud. Make sure the rack is level and mark the hole locations. Make a 1/8 in. diameter pilot hole in each marked location. Secure the wall mount rack to the wall stud with the three screws provided (Fig. 8).

MOUNTING THE VACUUM ONTO THE RACK

1. Your vacuum comes ready for dry vacuum cleaning. If the cartridge filter is not installed, refer to page 15 for installation instructions (Fig. 9 & 10).
2. For wet vacuum cleaning, remove the cartridge filter, and install the supplied foam wet filter. See page 15 for the foam wet filter installation instructions (Fig. 11).
3. Place the power head back on the collection tank, and secure into place using the 2 side latches (Fig. 12 & 13).
4. Mount the vacuum onto the wall mount rack by aligning the hanging hook on the rear of the vacuum with the slot on the wall mount rack and slide downward until it locks (Fig. 14).
5. Wind the excess power cord around the cord storage hook located on the side of the vacuum (Fig. 15).
6. Insert the locking end of the hose into the vacuum port of the collection tank and turn clockwise to lock into place (Fig. 16).
7. Choose the desired accessory, such as the remote control handle, and insert onto the end of the hose or extension wand (Fig. 17).

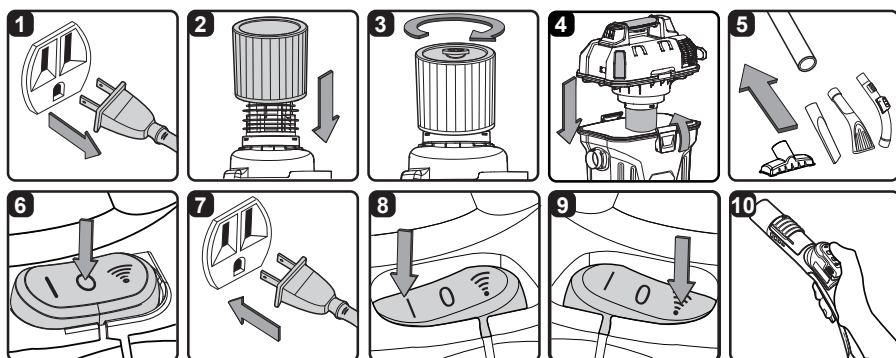
POLARIZED PLUG

To reduce the risk of electrical shock, this appliance has a polarized plug (one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit in a polarized outlet only one way. If the plug does not fit fully in the outlet, reverse the plug. If it still does not fit, contact a qualified electrician to install the proper outlet. Do not change the plug in any way. Double insulation  eliminates the need for the three wire grounded power cord and grounded power supply system.

DISMOUNTING THE VACUUM FROM THE RACK

1. Disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet (Fig. 18).
2. Lift the vacuum up and out of the rack by the handle (Fig. 19).

1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet (Fig. 1).
2. In order to prepare your vacuum for dry vacuuming, verify that the cartridge filter completely covers the filter cage. Your Wet/Dry Vacuum comes with the cartridge filter pre-installed. For installation instructions, see page 15 (Fig. 2).
3. Place filter retainer on top of cartridge filter and tighten down by turning the retainer handle clockwise (Fig. 3).
4. Place the power head back on the collection tank, aligning the top section with the latches, and lock into place (Fig. 4).

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS: DRY VACUUMING

5. Insert the locking end of the hose into the vacuum port and turn to lock into place. Choose the desired accessory and insert onto the end of the hose or extension wand (Fig. 5).
6. Verify that the switch is in the 'O' (OFF) position before plugging the power cord into the outlet (Fig. 6 & 7). Hang the vacuum onto the rack or use off the rack.
7. Turn the motor on by flipping the on/off switch to the 'I' (ON) position and begin vacuuming (Fig. 8).
8. For remote control use, set the on/off switch to remote control position "  " and turn the vacuum on by pressing the 'I' (ON) button on the remote control handle (Fig. 9 & 10).
9. Once you have completed vacuuming, press the on/off switch to the 'O' (OFF) position or press the 'O' (OFF) button on the remote control for at least one second.

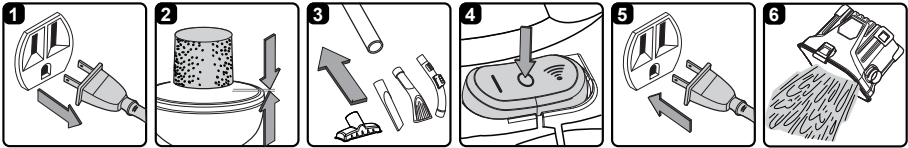

IMPORTANT! When vacuuming large volumes of liquids, we recommend that you remove the vacuum from the wall mount rack and put it on the floor. The vacuum can be heavy when full of liquids and may be difficult to remove from the rack.

1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet. Make sure that the collection tank is clean and free of dust and dirt (Fig. 1).
2. Remove the cartridge filter, then carefully install the foam wet filter over the filter cage and place the power head back on the collection tank. For foam wet filter installation instructions, see page 15 (Fig. 2).

DO NOT USE THE CARTRIDGE FILTER FOR LIQUID VACUUMING.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS: WET VACUUMING

3. Push the required attachment onto the free end of the hose or extension wand (Fig. 3).
4. Ensure that the on/off switch is in the 'O' OFF position before plugging the power cord into the outlet (Fig. 4 & 5).
5. Turn the motor on by flipping the switch on the power head to the 'I' ON position or flipping the switch to the remote control position "  " and use the 'I' ON button on the remote control.

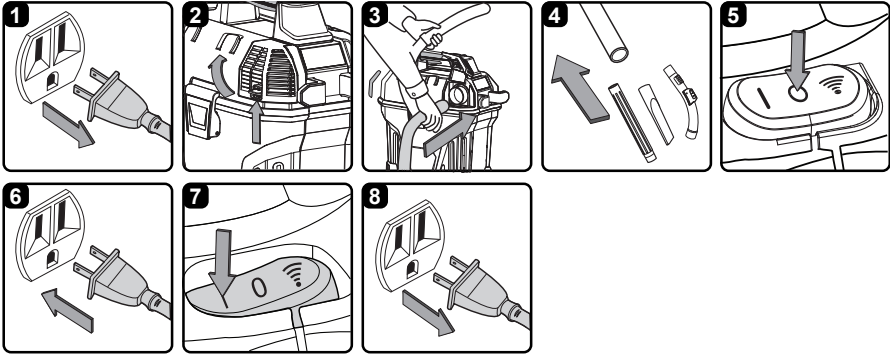
DO NOT SUBMERGE THE REMOTE CONTROL IN LIQUIDS.

6. After wet vacuuming, turn the machine off and remove plug from power supply. Empty the collection tank, clean, and dry the inside and outside of the collection tank (Fig. 6). Remove the foam wet filter and allow it to air dry before storage.

IMPORTANT! When vacuuming large quantities of liquids, do not immerse the nozzle completely in the liquid; leave a gap at the tip of the nozzle opening to allow air inflow. The machine is fitted with a float valve that stops the suction action when the collection tank reaches its maximum capacity. You will notice an increase in motor speed. When this happens, turn off the machine, disconnect from power supply, and empty the liquid into a suitable receptacle or drain. To continue vacuuming, refit the power head to the collection tank. After wet vacuuming, turn the machine off and remove plug from power supply. To prevent the risk of possible mildew, empty the collection tank, clean and dry the inside and outside of the collection tank. Remove the foam wet filter and allow it to air dry before storage.

REMEMBER! The foam wet filter must be removed after wet vacuuming, and a cartridge filter must be installed before dry vacuuming again.

BLOWER OPERATION



This Wet/Dry Vacuum has blowing capabilities. To use the blower feature follow the instructions listed.

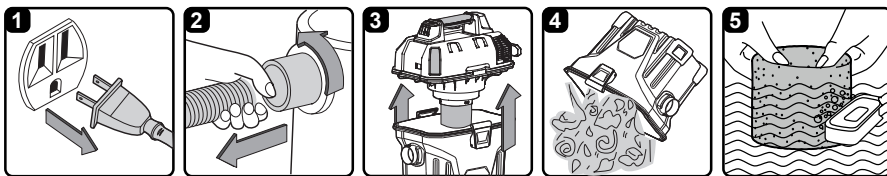
WARNING: KEEP BYSTANDERS CLEAR FROM BLOWING DEBRIS.



WARNING: WEAR A DUST MASK IF BLOWING CREATES DUST THAT MIGHT BE INHALED.

1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet (Fig. 1).
2. Make sure the collection tank is empty before using as a blower. Clear all dirt and debris from the hose and collection tank.
3. Lift the button on the blower filter door to the unlocked position and flip the blower filter door open (Fig. 2).
4. Remove the hose from the vacuum port and insert the locking end of the hose into the blower port on the power head and lock into position (Fig. 3).
5. Fit the desired extension wand and/or nozzle to the free end of the vacuum hose (Fig. 4).
6. Verify that the on/off switch is in the 'O' OFF position before plugging the power cord into the outlet (Fig. 5 & 6).
7. Before turning ON the vacuum, firmly hold the loose end of the hose. Turn the motor on by flipping the switch to the 'I' ON position or set the switch to the remote control setting and use the remote control (Fig. 7).
8. Once you have completed blowing, flip the on/off switch to the 'O' (OFF) position and unplug the power cord from the outlet (Fig. 8).

MAINTENANCE



EMPTYING THE COLLECTION TANK

! WARNING: ALWAYS DISCONNECT THE PLUG FROM THE POWER OUTLET BEFORE REMOVING THE POWER HEAD FROM COLLECTION TANK.

1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet (Fig. 1).
2. Disconnect the hose from the vacuum (Fig. 2).
3. Remove the vacuum from the wall mount rack.
4. Undo the latches and remove the power head from the collection tank (Fig. 3).
5. Clear all dirt or debris from the collection tank and hose into a proper waste container (Fig. 4).
6. Clean or replace the filters (Fig. 5).
7. Check the hose, attachments, and power cord to verify that they have not been damaged.
8. Place power head back on collection tank and secure latches.

IMPORTANT! Clean or change the cartridge filter regularly for best performance. **ALWAYS USE THE CARTRIDGE FILTER FOR DRY VACUUMING.** If the machine is used without the cartridge filter, the motor will burn out and the warranty will be voided. Always keep spare cartridge filters on hand.

NOTICE! The filters included are made of high quality materials designed to stop small dust particles. The cartridge filter should be used for dry pick-up only. A dry cartridge filter is necessary to pick up dust. If the cartridge filter is wet, it will clog quickly and be difficult to clean. Handle the filter carefully when removing it for cleaning or replacing. Check the filters for tears or small holes. A small hole can let dust pass through and out of the filter. Do not use a filter with holes or tears in it; replace it immediately.

BATTERY INSTRUCTIONS

- Always purchase the correct size and grade of battery most suitable for the intended use.
- Always replace the whole set of batteries at one time, taking care not to mix old and new ones, or batteries of different types.
- Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.
- Ensure the batteries are installed correctly with regard to polarity (+ and -).
- Remove batteries from equipment which is not to be used for an extended period of time.
- Remove used batteries promptly.

Batteries must be disposed of in a specified manner to prevent contamination of the environment. Before disposing of damaged or worn out batteries, contact your local waste disposal agency, or the local Environmental Protection Agency for information and specific instructions.

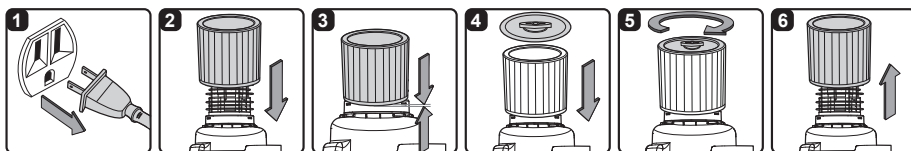
STORAGE

Before storing your vacuum, the collection tank should be emptied and cleaned. The cord should be wrapped around the cord storage hook located on the side of the vacuum and the hose should be stored on hose storage rack. Accessories can be stored on accessory storage and wall mount assembly. The vacuum should be stored indoors when not using.

REPAIRS

Repairs for this wet/dry vacuum should be performed only by qualified service personnel using only identical replacement parts.

INSTALLING & CLEANING CARTRIDGE FILTER



INSTALLING CARTRIDGE FILTER

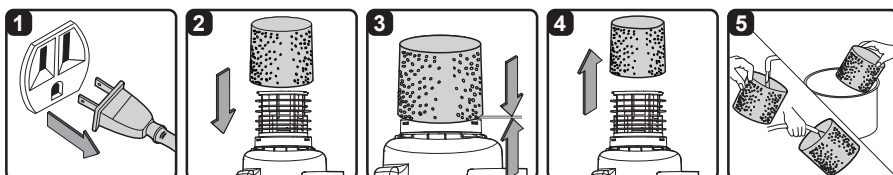
1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet (Fig. 1).
2. Remove the power head and place in upside down position.
3. Install the cartridge filter over the filter cage making sure the cage is completely covered. Carefully push filter in until it stops against the power head (Fig. 2 & 3).
4. Place the filter retainer on top of the cartridge filter over the raised lip and tighten down by turning the retainer clockwise; do not over-tighten (Fig. 4 & 5).
5. Place the power head back onto the collection tank.

REMOVING AND CLEANING CARTRIDGE FILTER

1. Unlock and remove the filter retainer by turning retainer handle counterclockwise.
2. Carefully remove the cartridge filter by sliding it off the filter cage (Fig. 6).
3. Clean the cartridge filter by gently tapping or brushing dirt off. Cleaning should not be done indoors in living areas. For optimal performance a new filter is recommended.
4. Install cleaned or new filter into place as instructed above.
5. Wet filters should be removed and allowed to air dry for 24 hours before installing onto the filter cage.

INSTALLING & CLEANING FOAM WET FILTER



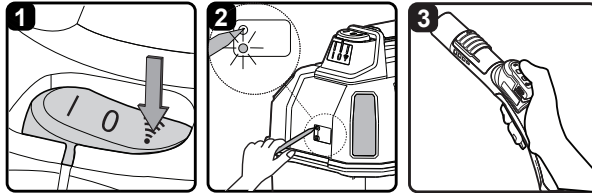
INSTALLING FOAM WET FILTER


1. Verify that the power cord is disconnected from the outlet (Fig. 1).
2. Remove the power head and place in upside down position. Follow instructions to remove the cartridge filter on page 15.
3. Carefully slide the foam wet filter down over the filter cage making sure the cage is completely covered (Fig. 2 & 3).
4. Place the power head onto the collection tank.

CLEANING FOAM WET FILTER

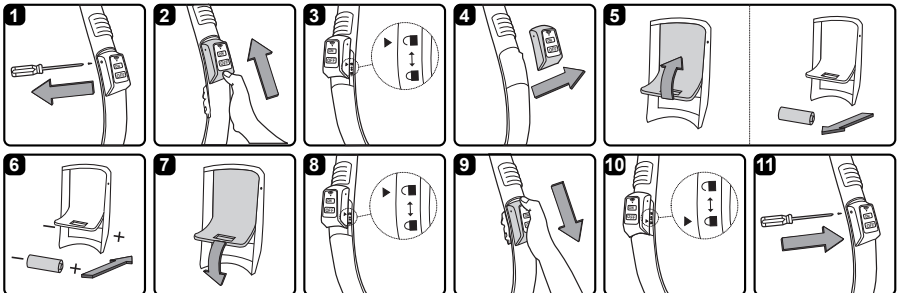
1. With the removed power head in an upside down position, carefully remove the foam wet filter (Fig. 4).
2. Use a mild soap and water solution to wash the foam wet filter and rinse with clean water (Fig. 5).
3. Allow the filter to air dry for 24 hours before installing onto the filter cage.




RESETTING THE REMOTE CONTROL



1. Have the remote control accessible. Set the power switch on the vacuum to the remote control position “” (Fig. 1).
2. Press the RESET button on the side of the power head with pointed object such as paper clip or a pen tip until the indicator lights up (Fig. 2).
3. Release the RESET button once the red indicator light lights up and immediately press and hold the “ON” button on the remote control handle until the vacuum powers on (Fig. 3).
4. If the “ON” button is not pressed and held within a 15 second window, the reset will not be successful. Repeat steps 2-3 to reset the remote control.

Changing The Battery - Replace Only With A 23AE 12V Alkaline Battery



1. Using a Phillips screwdriver, remove the screws on the remote control (Fig. 1).
2. Slide back the remote cover so that the white triangle on the remote cover points to the unlock symbol “” (Fig. 2 & 3).
3. Remove the remote cover from the handle (Fig. 4).
4. Lift the foam cover to expose the battery and remove the old battery (Fig. 5).
5. Insert the new battery with the terminals in the direction shown and make sure to replace the foam cover (Fig. 6 & 7).
6. Replace the remote control by aligning the white triangle on the side cover to the unlock symbol “” on the handle (Fig. 8).
7. Slide the remote cover so that the white triangle is over the locked symbol “” (Fig. 9 & 10).
8. Secure the cover with the screws. Do not over-tighten (Fig. 11).

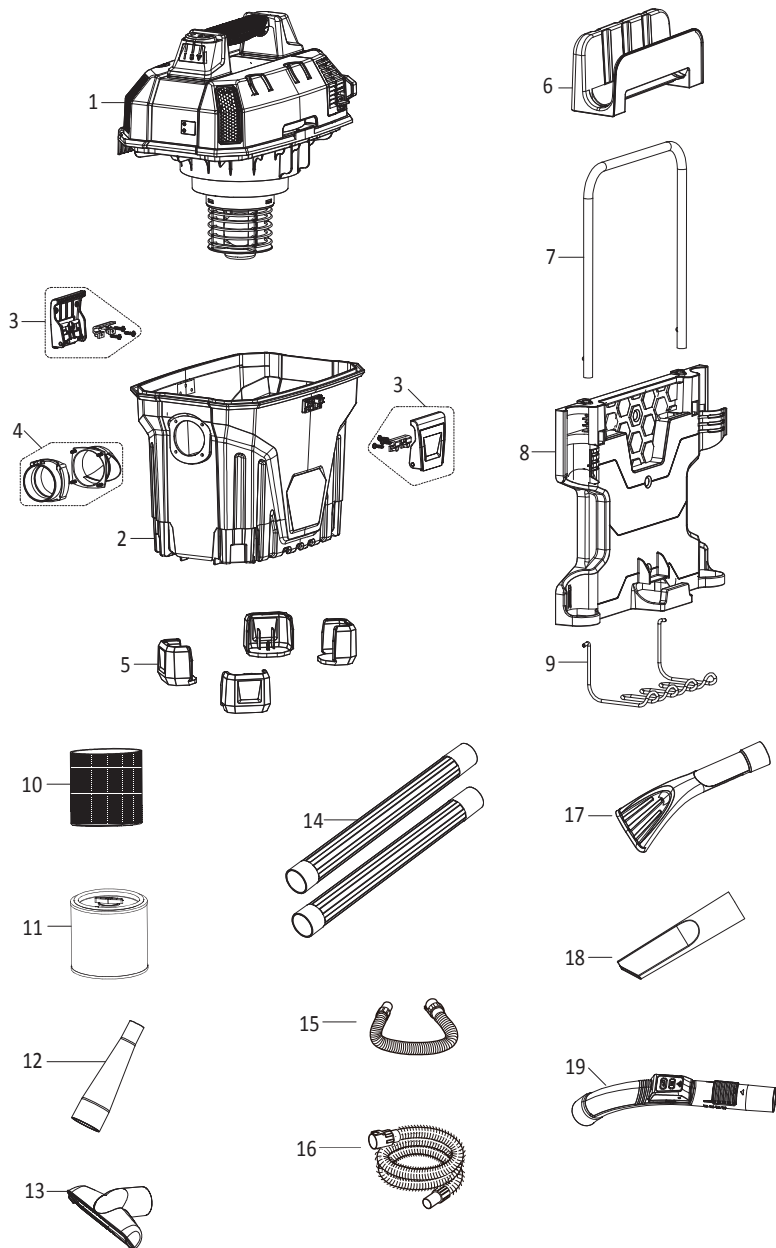
TROUBLESHOOTING



WARNING! TO REDUCE THE RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, UNPLUG BEFORE TROUBLESHOOTING.

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE CAUSE	SOLUTION
The wet/dry vacuum will not operate.	No power supply.	Check the power supply, cord, breakers, and fuses.
	Faulty power cord.	Unplug and check the power cord. If damaged, have it repaired by a professional.
	Collection tank is full.	Empty the collection tank.
	Switch in the wrong position.	Press the ON 'I' button on the power head.
The dust comes out from the motor cover.	The cartridge filter is missing or damaged.	Attach or replace the cartridge filter.
	Vacuum has been used to collect fine dust, such as dry wall dust, fireplace soot, or ash, without a fine dust filter equipped.	Remove the standard cartridge filter and install the appropriate fine dust cartridge filter.
Reduced efficiency and motor/speed vibration.	There is a blockage in the nozzle, hose, or the collection tank inlets. The cartridge filter is clogged by fine dust.	Check nozzle, hose and collection tank inlets for blockage. Take off the filter and clean it or install a new cartridge filter.
The remote control will not operate.	The remote control is not paired with the vac.	Reset the remote control using the instructions on page 16.
	The battery is dead.	Replace the battery.
